Completed UEC with at least B4 for five subjects (one of which is A2/A1). Math should be included.




Supporting Document Checklist

Prepare and make electronic copies of all relevant supporting documents.

- 701 Your photo Your passport identification page
- Academic qualification and results

 OA Chinese proficiency certification (HSK)
- 05 Personal statement06 Teacher's reference letter
- *07* Police clearance certificate
- Unified exam results (SAT, IB, A Level)
- Application fee payment slip

- Guarantee of financial support from personal sponsor(s)
- Physical examination report if you apply for scholarship
- Chinese visa/residence permit if you live or stay in China



When Applying

- Apply online when the application opens
- Make payment of CNY830 for the application via bank transfer
- Submit supporting documents electronically via your application form at applicant portal
- Log into the applicant portal to make any changes in information or documents


Submit Your Application



We recommend: submit complete application by the deadline

Tips:

- Set aside 20-30 minutes to complete the online application form.
- Complete all relevant sections with correct information and upload supporting documents before submitting it online.



After Applying

- Tracking application status via the applicant portal
- Attend interview (and written exams, if required) if you are shortlisted
- Accept admission offer before the stipulated deadline
- Receive the admission package

Admission Assessments

Written exam

- Math, April 15 (Saturday)*
 - * Applicants of Chinese language only take Chinese exam.
- Chinese, April 15 (Saturday)

The written exam applies if

you plan to apply Shanghai government scholarship, OR

you apply for a major other than Chinese language and are not eligible for written exam exemption

Interview

- If you are required to sit in the written exam(s), your interview falls on the same day (April 15) as the exam(s).
- If you are exempted from the written exam(s), Admission Office will notify you via email on when to take the interview.
